







Points of Distinction

More than 1,250 CSM students transferred to 215 different colleges and universities in 2023-24. Destinations include Maryland's universities and highly regarded schools across the nation.

CSM is recognized by the National Security Agency and the U.S. Department of Homeland Security as a National Center of Academic Excellence in Information Assurance. CSM ranks as the 57th best overall community college out of 653 nationwide and 8th best among Maryland community colleges, according to WalletHub.

CSM has twice been recognized among the top 150 community colleges in the country by the Aspen Institute in its Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence.

Talking Points

CSM is the **sixth largest community college** in Maryland.

Students save, on average, more than \$31,000 on their bachelor's degree by starting at CSM and transferring with an associate degree.

63% of CSM students attend part time.

94% of CSM's full-time faculty hold a master's or doctoral degree.

In FY24, CSM awarded **753** associate degrees and **555** certificates.

More than 1,600 high school students participated in dual enrollment in the 2023-24 academic year, with more than 170 enrolled in CSM's Early College program.

In the past five years, the CSM Foundation has awarded **\$4.6 million in scholarships** to more than 4,000 students.






