NOTES: The Bachelor of Science in Nursing (RN to BSN) is available only to students who have an associate's degree in nursing or who have completed an approved registered nursing education program and resides in and has an active, unencumbered RN license in an approved state (visit [UMGC's Nursing Web-site](#) for the most up-to-date list of approved states) / Student is placed in Pre-BSN status at time of admission into the BSN program and remains in that status until completion of all Gen Ed and related requirement courses / [^] = Complies with Maryland RN to BSN articulation model, associate's degree nursing credits will not be transferred in the BSN degree plan—instead students are awarded 30 upper-level credits from their active, unencumbered RN license (acquired after passing the NCLEX) / Minimum of 120 credits, including 30 with UMGC of which at least 15 must be upper-level (courses numbered 300-499), are required for the bachelor's degree with a UMGC grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 (C) or higher / At least one-half of the credits within the major and minor must be comprised of: a. traditional college courses earning a grade (except for the CJLE major); b. UMGC resident coursework (except for the APTC, CJLE, and GECU majors, which require only the major capstone as UMGC resident credit) / No course within the major or minor below the grade of C (2.0) / UMGC does not accept grades below a C (2.0) in transfer from schools outside of the University System of Maryland and the Maryland community colleges (except WRTG 112 which must be completed with a grade of C- (1.67) or better from all schools) / Maximum of 70 transfer credits to UMGC from two-year or community colleges & maximum of 90 transfer credits from all sources combined (actual number of transfer credits dependent on meeting all UMGC bachelor's degree requirements) / [◆] = Course in major at UMGC / ^{*} = Lower-level course meets the content requirement of upper-level course but does not transfer as upper-level / ^{UL} = Upper-level course (numbered 300-499) / ⁺ = Students seeking the BSN must fulfill these requirements before admission to the program
